#### H. ROAD SAFETY

The school's Traffic Management Plan for 2023 can be found on the school website at the top navigation bar under "For Parents" > "School Information" > "Traffic Management Plan".

For parents driving in and out of the school, please exercise care and patience, especially during the morning peak hours i.e. 7am to 7.30am. The situation during this period is very challenging due to the many concurrent competing needs at the main gate junction - vehicles entering and leaving, pedestrians crossing, the need to optimise the traffic flow in tandem with the traffic light crossing along Choa Chu Kang Ave 4.

Drivers should also note that, when exiting the school main gate, they should pay particular attention to passing pedestrians and cyclists, especially those coming from the left.

Parents/Guardians may wish to consider using Gates 4 and 12 (which are besides Blk 446 and Blk 451 respectively) as alternative drop off points which also provide safe and sheltered access into the school.

Please be reminded to adhere to the speed limit (15km/h) when driving in the school compound and to also drop off your child/ward only at the designated area at the foyer.

The Ministry of Education (MOE) will be conducting the yearly photo-taking exercise for the issuance of the School Smart Card (SSC). P1 students will get their SSCs by end March, while the photo-images captured for P6 students will be used for the printing of Secondary SSCs when they are promoted to Secondary One in 2024. # K. SEXUALITY EDUCATION IN THE SCHOOL CURRICULUM - THE GROWING YEARS

Sexuality Education lessons are conducted in the school for primary 5 and primary 6 students under the ambit of Character and Citizenship Education (CCE) with the following objectives:

- To help students make wise, responsible and informed decisions through the provision of accurate, current and age-appropriate **knowledge** on human sexuality and the consequences of sexual activity
- To help students know themselves and build healthy and rewarding relationships through the acquisition of social
  and emotional skills of self-awareness, management of their thoughts, feelings and behaviours, development of
  empathy for others, possession of effective communication, problem-solving and decision-making skills
- To help students develop a moral compass, respect for themselves and for others as sexual beings, premised on
  the heterosexual married couple forming a nuclear family as the basic unit of society, through the inculcation of
  positive mainstream values and attitudes about sexuality

The lessons are taught by only MOE-trained Sexuality Education teachers and covered the following dimensions:

- Physical: Physical sexual maturation and intimacy, the physiology of sex and human reproduction
- Emotional: Sexual attitudes and feelings towards self and others
- Social: Sexual norms and behaviour and their legal, cultural, and societal implications
- Ethical: Values and moral systems related to sexuality

The school will send out registration forms to all P3 pupils for the GEP Screening Exercise in July 2023. It is not compulsory for the pupils to take part.

The GEP Identification Exercise aims to identify suitable pupils with high intellectual potential. Test-preparation activities could inflate pupils' scores and not reflect their actual potential. Pupils who are not ready to handle the intellectual rigour and demands of the programme will struggle with the enriched curriculum and not benefit fully from it. This would put undue stress on the pupils and may even cause them to lose confidence and impact their self-esteem.

# O. Student Learning Space (SLS)

All Primary 1 to 6 students have been provisioned with a Student Learning Space (SLS) account. The portal facilitates online and blended learning, allowing students to extend their learning beyond the classroom.

Primary 1 students will receive a letter and guide to complete their first-time logging in and onboarding process in school. Their Form Teachers will provide more details nearing the date.

# Q. No Music Textbooks for P1, P2, P5, P6 levels

MOE will be revising the Music syllabus in stages. There will not be textbooks for Primary 1 and 2 students this year.

The Music Unit of Concord Primary School started implementing the In-House Music Modules for Primary 5 and 6 students in 2020. The music modules consist of teaching and learning resources that are designed by qualified music teachers and are aligned to the MOE Music syllabus. The Music Unit will also be producing a set of in-house music resources designed for the teaching and learning of music at the lower primary levels

This customised curriculum will allow our students to listen, create and perform music through active musical experiences, and will draw on students' learning and understanding of musical elements and concepts through local and global repertoire. To help track students' progress of their learning, self and peer evaluation as well as reflections will be conducted at various junctures, termly.

As such, Primary 1, 2, 5 and 6 students are not required to purchase Music Textbook. In replacement, all students will keep their work in the grey music file. The music file has been included in the Primary 1 Booklist. Primary 2 to 6 students can reuse the files that were purchased last year. The grey music files can be purchased from the school bookshop.

# R. Modular CCA Programme Term 1

The Primary 3 to P6 classes will be having Modular CCA according to the schedule below.

P3 students will be involved in the Sports Talent Identification Programme. Students will be exposed to Niche Sports CCAs such as Sepak Takraw, Volleyball, Floorball and Badminton. Students who exhibit talent in these CCAs will then receive additional training during the Niche CCA sessions conducted after school.
