Dear Parents,

How time flies! Today is the start of the 7th week of Term 1. In this week's newsletter, let's shine a spotlight on the Modular Co-Curricular Activities (MCCA) programme in Concord and the modules that the P3 and P4 students are taking part in this term.

The aims of MCCA are to enable the holistic development of students through a wide variety of activities. These activities cover the physical, socio-emotional, psychological needs and well-being of a student. MCCA exposes students to activities that complement classroom learning. Students get to experience interesting and novel activities outside of the classroom setting. By participating in these activities, students will appreciate the significance of the skills and values learned and apply them to their chosen career path.

MCCA acts as the base of Concord's CCA programme. All students from P3 to P6 participate in MCCA. It is conducted once a week, every Wednesday, from 7.30am to 9am. MCCA covers 7 modules in 5 different domains. In the cognitive domain, students learn skills on information and communication technology (ICT). In the aesthetics domain, students are exposed to the performing arts of dance and music, as well as visual arts. In the moral domain, students equip themselves in life skills such as sewing and packing their school bags. In the physical domain, students participate in outdoor education and sports activities. Lastly, to address our students' development in the domain of leadership, the Soar For Life Programme has been designed to provide an integrated approach in honing leadership skills with reasoning and executive functioning skills in a coherent and holistic way.

In Term 1, the P3 students are involved in the Sports Talent Identification Programme. P3 students are exposed to Niche Sports CCAs such as Sepak Takraw, Volleyball and Floorball. Students who exhibit talent in these CCAs will receive additional training during the Niche CCA sessions conducted after school. The P4 students are using these 10 weeks to equip themselves with valuable ICT and coding skills.

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We envision that, through MCCA, our students will become all-rounders who has a passion for learning and develop the confidence to face the challenges of life. See you in the next newsletter!
