


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4. P4 Hydroponics Enrichment Programme

Our Primary 4 students leveraged on our Hydroponics greenhouse to grow red spinach in school. This term, the 4C and 4E classes were given hands-on experience of farming (other Primary 4 classes will have their turns in Semester 2); from transplanting seedlings to harvesting the adult plant after 2 to 3 weeks! This lesson also took on a blended learning approach with a 3-part SLS lesson, where students will refresh on their learnings of plants and learn more about the functions of the different plant parts.

Through this experience, not only will they be able to learn more about Life Science, it also inculcates the values of responsibility and care towards plants and their environment.
