

Students will acquire the ability to make links across different areas of knowledge and to generate, develop and evaluate ideas and information so as to apply these skills to the project task.

Students will acquire the skills to communicate effectively and present ideas clearly and coherently to a specific audience in both written and oral forms.

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The IPW theme for the Primary 3 students was water sustainability. The students visited Marina Barrage to learn more about how Singapore strategise and seeks innovative ideas and develop capabilities to secure a sustainable supply of water. The students had to design a water filter as part of their IPW project. Working together in teams gave them the opportunity to collaborate on their learning.

















The Primary 4 students focused on food sustainability. The students visited Republic Polytechnic during their Learning Journey to find out more about urban vegetable farming in Singapore. They had to design new menus to include local produce and alternative food options as part of their IPW project. They had an enjoyable time unleashing their creativity to come up with interesting dishes that included novel food items such as plant-based meat and even insects!
