C. ADMINISTRATION MATTERS

C1 School Bill

From Feb 2018, parents will receive a School Bill prepared by CPS, for enrichment programmes which you have given consent for your child's participation. The School Bill is similar to MOE Bill for school and miscellaneous fees.

For Singaporean Students: If you have authorised the Edusave Enrichment Programme Standing Order (EPSO), CPS will make withdrawals from your child's/ward's Edusave account to pay for enrichment programme charges. If your child's Edusave funds is insufficient, or if you did not authorise the EPSO, cash payment can be made via

1. AXS Self Service Kiosks
2. AXS e-Station (www.axs.com.sg)
3. Cash/ Cheque (to be given to the school)
4. GIRO Option

For non-Singaporean Students: Payment can also be made via the same four modes listed above.

C3 School Bookshop

The school bookshop will be open from 8.00 am to 3.00 pm on Mondays to Fridays, during Term Time. The lunch hour will be from 12.00 pm to 1.00 pm.

As the school bookshop is located at the canteen, it will not be open to parents during recess times so as to reduce congestion and to better enable our students to visit the bookshop. To inculcate responsibility and independence in our students, we encourage parents to allow their children to purchase the necessary items themselves. Therefore, parents who need to make purchases will only be allowed to do so from 11.00 am to 12.00 pm.

D. LAUNCH OF SMARTPHONE COMMUNICATION SYSTEM: SCHOOL NOTIFICATION ACKNOWLEDGEMENT CONSOLE (SNAC)

CPS will be implementing a smartphone communication system, SNAC, with effect from February 2018. SNAC is an app that allows you to receive real-time notifications and circulars from school and allows real-time digital acknowledgement to e-consent forms regarding your child's/ward's school activities through your smart phones. We aim to achieve a higher level of communication effectiveness and workflow efficiency in our information dissemination and communication with parents/guardians, as well as promote green movement for the environment in paper reduction. Therefore, we will cease the hardcopy notification distribution to all students from next month. Parents/guardians can also retrieve the monthly Notification on the CPS website.

For a start, parents/ guardians are required to download and install this free smartphone application which is located via a keyword search 'SNAC' from Apple App Store or Android Google Play. Please visit our school website (<http://concordpri.moe.edu.sg>) to retrieve a step-by-step guide to help you with the one-time registration. Please be assured that all registration information will be kept strictly confidential. Should you encounter any technical problems, please email snac.support@apptitude.sg and the SNAC support team will revert as soon as possible. We sincerely hope that with this new technology, we can achieve better communications and higher efficiency in serving you.

E. PERSONAL DATA PROTECTION
