### B. GREETINGS FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

In Concord Primary School (CPS), we aim to cultivate our students as responsible and independent persons who take personal responsibility for their own actions. A very good example is taking care of their own belongings. Forgetfulness is common amongst students and it is a sign that they lack personal responsibility. Our teachers have taught and encouraged students to pack their bags so that they remember to bring the required items for lessons, to school. Students should take responsibility if they have forgotten to bring any item to school and not expect their parents to bring the items to school for them, as it causes inconvenience to others when assistance is required, to deliver their belongings.

Home-school partnership is critical in this endeavour to inculcate personal responsibility in our students. We will remind teachers not to ask students to call home and request for the delivery of items they have forgotten to bring to school. Together, teachers and parents must message to the students that they must take personal responsibility and face the consequences of their actions or non-actions. However, we recognize that some items, eg wallets, spectacles or medication, are critical for our students. Therefore, the school will only facilitate delivery of critical items if necessary.

#### C1 eRegistration with MFA during Travel

All parents/guardians who are travelling out of Singapore for holidays are encouraged to monitor the health situations in the countries of travel and to refer to the website of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MFA) for travel advisories. Please remain vigilant and observe measures recommended by local health authorities when travelling overseas. If you are travelling overseas, please eRegister with MFA at <http://eregister.mfa.gov.sg/> to facilitate contact tracing in the event of an emergency.

#### C2 Online Travel Declaration For The Term 1 School Holidays

Please inform the school of your children's/wards' travel plans for the Term 1 School Holidays, by indicating your details in MCOonline from **02.03.2018 onwards**. Please note that you can submit the Travel Declaration more than once if you are travelling to more than 1 country and sign on the space given before submitting the information.

If you are not able to submit your reply through MCOonline, hardcopies of the form are available at the General Office. Your children/wards may submit the hardcopies of the completed Travel Declaration forms to the General Office.

### C3 Survey for Phase 1 Registration of Children for Admission to Primary One in 2019

This is a priority phase for siblings of students who are currently studying in CPS. All children registered under this phase will be given places in the school. The child to be registered must be a **Singapore Citizen/Singapore Permanent Resident** and must be born between **02.01.2012 and 01.01.2013 (both dates inclusive)**. Please complete the attached form, by **09.03.2018**. We will provide all parents of CPS students with siblings eligible for 2019 Phase 1, so that a hard copy of the 2019 Primary 1 Registration Form may be given to.

#### **D. ONLINE CONSENT FOR IMMUNISATION SERVICES**

To support your child's wellbeing, the Health Promotion Board has been providing free health services, such as screening, immunisation and dental checks in schools. Parents must give their consent before their children receive the services. To make the submission of consent more convenient and secure, the Health Promotion Board has launched the Child Consent Portal (<https://childconsent.hpb.gov.sg>). Please submit your consent online by **09.03.2018**; it only takes three simple steps:

- 1) Log on to <https://childconsent.hpb.gov.sg> using your SingPass with 2-factor authentication (2FA)
- 2) Type in your child's NRIC/BC/FIN
- 3) Fill up and submit the medical form


