C. ADMINISTRATION MATTERS

C1 Contract for Group Personal Accident (GPA) Insurance for Students.

It commences on 01.01.2018, for all students, including those attending the Student Care Centre. The product fact sheet and the claim form have been uploaded onto the school website, http://concordpri.moe.edu.sg/our-partners/our-services-provider, and you may refer to it for more details.

C2 POSB Smart Buddy Programme

Some parents have approached the school to ask about this pogramme, which was launched in the school since 2017. It is the first in the world wearable tech for kids to make payment digitally and at the same time, allow parents to monitor the children's spending and savings. It's designed to encourage children to embrace technology from young, as an extension to the National School Savings Campaign - enabling students to make payments/purchases digitally. This includes purchasing of meals, stationery and also Saving Stamps which translates into savings in their account. Parents who would like to sign up for their children may do so directly via this website which POSB has created for the school: www.posb.com.sq/ccps.

D. SCHOOL SAFETY

(Mr David Wang, VP(A))

Our students' safety is important, and we constantly remind them to practise the kerb drill when they are crossing the road. Kerb drill is, 'to look right, look left, look right again, and if the road is clear, raise hand, walk straight across quickly'. Similarly, we urge parents to convey the same message to them when they are at home. As they are still minors, it is important for them to practise the kerb drill.

We urge parents to make use of Gates 4 and 12 for their children to alight in the morning instead of driving into the school, so as to reduce the risk for students who walk to school. Furthermore, it is a shorter walk from Gates 4 and 12 to the hall where we conduct the flag raising ceremony every morning.

Parents who fetch their children at dismissal should park their cars at the HDB car parks and wait for them at the designated gates. Please do not park your cars near the junction, fire hydrant, road bend, the CPS main gate or the service roads at Gates 4 and 12, as it is an offence to park illegally along public roads. Please note that the Traffic Police patrols these areas regularly. You are also strongly advised against leaving your vehicles' engines on while waiting for your children as it is harmful for the environment.

E. EVACUATION DRILL

To commemorate Total Defence Day and also to be Emergency Ready for any potential safety and security threat, CPS will be conducting an evacuation drill on 14.02.2018. The drill will inculcate in Concordians a sense of urgency when faced with any emergency situation. They will get to know the safe location to proceed to, in an emergency. Our staff will be around to lead the students to the assembly area and look out for the safety of our students during the drill.

F. TOTAL DEFENCE DAY & CHINESE NEW YEAR CELEBRATION

We will be commemorating Total Defence Day and celebrating Chinese New Year on Thu,15.02.2018. All students will report for school at 7.20 am and be dismissed from school at 10.00 am. Parents/caregivers are strongly advised to be punctual in fetching their children/wards at 10.00 am. School buses will also be informed of the early dismissal. School will resume for all students on Tue, 20.02.2018.

The theme for Total Defence Day 2018 is "Together We Keep Singapore Strong". Singapore has remained safe and peaceful over the past 52 years because of the efforts of all Singaporeans. As we celebrate Chinese New Year, we would like to take this opportunity to remind our students to put Total Defence into action in their daily lives by reaching out to one another, forging new relationships and strengthening the existing ones to keep Singapore strong and resilient because our greatest strength lies in the unity and resilience of our people. To bask in the festive mood of the Chinese New Year, all students will be allowed to come adorned in their festive attire and white school shoes (skirts/dresses should at least be knee length).
